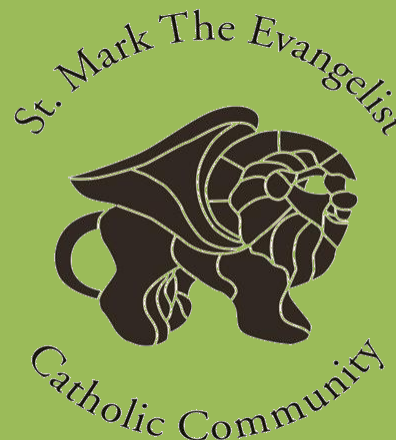

Pastoral Year July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018

Each year, at the end of June, assignment changes take place throughout our Diocese of Lansing. It is the time of saying "good-bye" and saying "hello" to each other. These transitions take a great deal of energy for both the priests and the parishes. I invite you to pray for the many parishes and priests that are in this transition period.

Mission and Money - You have often heard me speak about this topic many times. All Mission activity we call ministry needs Money to fund the necessary work of the Gospel. The Corporal Works of Mercy are the concrete ways we build up the reign of God on earth and in our "corner of the world." So Mission with Money makes a great difference on the individual, communal and global levels. Money without a Mission results too often in poor choices made by those who have wealth, but no plan as to how to responsibly manage it. Their lives become shambles and often end up in criminal cases.

This is the final reflection by Rev. Paul Turner in this series. **The Collection** is about how we use our Money toward Mission in our Weekend and Holy Day collection.

"The weekly collection humbly expresses the community's faith. The silent routine accompanies the spirit of selflessness that unites believers. Whether your gift is large or small, the collection expresses what we have in common a desire to share.

In the Mass, the collection occurs at the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Its placement is significant. It is not an admission fee to get into the building. It is part of the heart of the Mass. Every Mass celebrates the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. That sacrifice unfolds before our eyes as the gifts we bring, the bread and wine, are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ and offered to God.

This sacrificial action begins when we carry bread and wine to the altar during the preparation of the gifts. With the bread and wine, we bring our gifts for the poor. This procession moves through the community because these gifts come from us and represent us. They represent our offering to God and our communion with God. Just as the Body and Blood of Christ bring heavenly nourishment to our community, so the collection brings material aid.

That material aid is no small matter. Your church depends on your gift. Parishes receive money like beggars, not like clerks. People give not to receive a product; they give to make a gift.

The charity which underlies the collection results from faith. We believe that what we have comes from God and we know it was given for the enjoyment of all. A habit of giving comes from a heart that has learned the satisfactions of generosity. A habit of giving offers us peace that we are doing our part to make the world a better, more generous place.

The Scriptures recommend a tithing 10 percent of what we earn to charities. By giving from what we receive, we share God's love with the world."

Today we have the beautiful story of the woman promised a child, the wonderful exhortation about life in Christ, and a powerful instruction from Jesus. An embarrassment of riches? Not if we take Jesus' words about "welcome" to heart. The many challenges and blessings offered to us today by Elisha, Paul, and Jesus should be cause for rejoicing, and welcomed heartily into our lives. And, like the great treat that they are, they should be enjoyed and shared generously with others.

Today's reading from Romans was chosen very early in the liturgical life of the Church to be the sole apostolic instruction received by candidates for baptism at the Easter Vigil. This illustrates its importance as a core belief, and as a means of comprehending the story of the Resurrection. Christ's resurrection is not merely a story about something that he underwent once upon a time, but it is our story, the story of how we joined the other members of the one Body of Christ, the church. We were not only dead, but we were buried; not ultimately buried, but raised to eternal life with Christ.
