A PRAYER FOR THE ROAD

Summer is vacation time, the season when many of us take to the open road with a different attitude. We usually use our automobiles as machines to transport us to work and to help us meet other obligations. But in these months of summer, our cars become escape vehicles from the routines of our work-a-day lives.

Those seeking an integrated holiness do not restrict prayer to Sundays, to church or even to daily times of formal prayer. Instead, every activity of their lives is engaged as prayer. As Americans, we all spend a significant amount of time inside an automobile, and we should not exclude that travel time from our life of prayer.

St. Paul told us, "Whatever you eat, whatever you drink, whatever you do at all, do it for the glory of God" (1 Cor. 10: 31). As twentieth century Christians, it is easy to exclude our use of machines from our prayer lives and so lose frequent opportunities to give glory to God. We usually think that God is given glory by stunning stained-glass windows or deeds of heroic charity. Indeed, how many of us believe that our use of our washing machine or car can be an act of worship? Yet St. Paul was clear in saying, "Whatever you do, do it for the glory of God." Good prayer is like an alarm clock. Its purpose is to wake us up to the reality that all life is intended to be prayer, is meant to give glory to God. So, as you begin to drive with a fresh summertime attitude, why not begin to see your time in your car as prayer time. An excellent way to do this is to make a brief formal prayer before you step on the gas. The options for such a prayer are numerous. You could say a prayer we all know by heart, "Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts which we are about to receive from thy bounty." While we usually restrict that prayer to meal times, it would be a wonderful eye opener to all the gifts of sight, travel and adventure that are available in a car – even in a short drive to the store.

Such a prayer could also be an expression of our need for God to bless us with protection as we take responsibility for operating a machine that is potentially very dangerous to our health and safety and that of others. With the passage of safety belt laws, we have a daily ritual that is hungry to be made holy. As you wrap yourself in your safety belt, you could make it a sacred ritual by praying, "Wrap me in your love, O God, and bless my journey." A small sign of the cross could also be traced upon your safety belt where it crosses your heart.

And as humorous as it might sound, praying our traditional meal blessing would be a double blessing for about 25% of us. According to a recent survey, at least 25% of American commuters eat breakfast in their cars!"
