

Summer days seem to pass quickly; I hope that your Fourth of July included some rest and relaxation. Lately, I hear many people saying how summer seems half over, yet we have two months roughly until Labor Day. I spoke at the Masses last weekend about my retreat and vacation in Senegal, West Africa. While we are in ordinary time, liturgically, my experience there was extraordinary. Yes, the time flew by quickly.

Week 1: I arrived and stayed with the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart (MSC) at the retreat house located on property of the Diocese of Kaolack, which was founded by the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart. The altar was in the shape of the Sacred Heart and during my entire prayer, I felt as though I was being held by a Sacred Heart. My retreat is always a valued time and the days spent allowed me to discern many areas of my life and ministry. Each day, the Sacred Scriptures revealed encounters past, present, and future that reflect and parallel my life and the lives of those around me. The temperatures were in the mid-nineties to above one hundred so I was grateful that I like the heat! Mass each day was in French, Wolof, or Sari, depending on who attended the 7 a.m. liturgy. For exercise, I helped rake mango leaves before the first rains began. My meals were typical of the region: eggs, bread, yogurt, mango, and fish. The retreat house is located about 20 minutes outside the city, which means there was no internet or Wi-Fi. I didn't mind that, but the power outages determined my bedtime.

Week 2: During my time, I met the catechists at their annual retreat day, and I met with the priests of the Diocese, who gathered for their quarterly regional meeting. Many of the catechists and priests spoke some English. Most of them speak 4-7 languages, which I always find amazing! I now have a challenge to learn some French. During the weekend of June 24th and 25th, I participated in Fr. Jean Marie's (MSC) priesthood anniversary Mass, reception and family dinner. Each encounter was incredible. The choir and assembly sang in three languages, and I felt as if I were in a concert. Their enthusiastic worship was an inspiration. I was very moved when Jean Marie gave his thank-you's after communion. He was emotional and couldn't speak. The choir immediately chimed in with a song of support. His mother, who recently lost her sight, stood up and began to dance in the main isle in support of her son. Needless to say, there was not a dry eye in the church. The reception at his home parish was beautiful. The attention to detail was amazing; from the setting of the tables, to the service and the meal: all simple, but elegant. The last event was scheduled in the family compound located outside of the town. There was a dance that expressed their identity. I have never seen people with so much energy, movement and rhythm. I did participate in a few, which drew cheers because the "foreigner" was willing to dance, with spirit if not skill. These beloved memories will last for a lifetime.

In general, as a Jesuit priest mentioned to me, Senegal could be the model for interreligious dialogue. The Christian population is only 6% and the remainder Muslim. Within Jean Marie's family, there are Christian and Muslim members who live together in harmony. I hope that a more peaceful coexistence can be the norm for our world. We pray for dialogue and toleration.
