Parish Appreciation Reception

Our annual parish appreciation reception on Saturday for the "Time and Talent" of Stewardship gives pause to acknowledge all the efforts that enhance the Mission of Jesus in our parish. There are countless expressions of goodness that bring life not only to us but to others. Certainly, during this 40th Anniversary Year, there is always gratitude to the "Charter Members" that had the stamina and vision to begin a new parish. Forty years later we are about the continuation of those faithful men and women.

The Finance and Pastoral Council members throughout the pastoral year give their witness for the welfare of our parish. The 10-Year Pastoral Plan (July, 2010- June, 2020) gives the 'roadmap' to be able to accomplish the important and necessary **Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy:**

Corporal Works of Mercy are feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick, visiting the imprisoned and burying the dead.

Spiritual Works of Mercy are admonishing the sinner, instructing the ignorant, counseling the doubtful, comforting the sorrowful, and bearing wrongs patiently, forgiving all injuries and praying for the living and the dead.

The Parish Pastoral Commissions – Education/Formation, Parish Life, Social Justice and Spiritual Development members help make possible the wonderful variety of activities that happen at our parish through their committed witness. The next parish commissions meeting is Tuesday, May, 15 after the 6:30 p.m. Mass. You are invited to come and see the valuable ministry each commission is about.

The 10-Year Pastoral Plan has the goal to encourage full participation of all members in our parish community. The three major areas of concentration accented are Discipleship, Leadership and Stewardship.

Discipleship objectives: to become a welcoming community, to become a Community of inclusiveness and to develop a social justice consciousness.

Leadership objectives: to develop Pastoral Staff, Councils and Commissions, to work with Councils/Commissions to expand Parishioner Involvement, and to develop a youth/young adult ministry (High School/Young Adults – 18 to 35 years of age).

Stewardship objectives: to implement a comprehensive understanding of Stewardship, to increase Weekly Sunday Offerings (treasure), and to design a comprehensive plan for future Capital Improvements (land, buildings & equipment).

The complete 10-Year Pastoral Plan with all of the goals, objectives and strategies is available on the parish website. As I am writing this article, there is great satisfaction in seeing how much of this plan has been realized. As one of my friends says, "So many times 10-Year Pastoral Plans just get put on a shelf". Thanks to all of you who have written the current history. Your dedication to the life and mission of our parish is appreciated.

Administrative Assistant Caitie Essenmacher, who is expecting her first baby in July, is choosing to remain at home. She finished her service here last Friday. Karen Mackey is returning to this position on Monday, having worked here previously. I am grateful to both for making this transition easier for all of us.

**Fifth Sunday of Easter
LIVING BRANCHES**

The Gospel and second reading for this Fifth Sunday of Easter emphasize the need for us to remain in Christ, and he in us. This shared life finds expression in the image of the one vine and many branches. We become living branches of the vine, members of the Body of Christ through baptism, Eucharist, and confirmation, sacraments of sharing God's own life. The First Letter of John describes the fruit of this vine as active love of neighbor: "And his commandment is this: we should believe . . . and love one another" (1 John 3:23).

Our first reading from Acts shows us an example of someone who shares in Christ's life in the person of Saint Paul. Paul's fearless witness, even at the risk of his life, is proof to everyone that the risen Lord's Spirit truly fills him with life and is bearing fruit in him.
